



Autumn



Mathematics

Repeated patterns making, using sticks, conkers, leaves and acorns

Numerical equivalence- pairing numbers with the same amount of conkers

Ascending and descending order-ordering sticks from shortest to the longest or the other way around

Acorn addition- use acorns for simple addition problems

Pumpkin measuring- se string to measure pumpkin circumferences and compare

Autumn sensory tray- hide numbers in a tray filled with autumn items for children to find and identify

Role-play Area

clothes Display- welly boots, warm clothes, umbrella, scarves
Create a shop to sell conkers, acorns, leaves and sticks

Music Area

Musical instruments (drums, bells, tambourines) to create sounds

Malleable Area

Playdough imprints- use pinecones, sticks, leaves to leave imprints in playdough

Apple orchards- set up small trees (branches in playdough) and have your child hang a specific number of apples (small balls made of playdough) on each tree

Construction Area

Make a cosy den for reading time

- Sorting- sort long sticks by length
- Estimating the number of sticks needed
- Problem-solving- discuss out how to make the den stable and how to create an entrance
- Spatial awareness: Guide your child in understanding how to arrange sticks to create an enclosed space.

Investigation Area

Detailed observation- explore pumpkin and sunflower seeds using magnifying glasses.

Compare the appearance of seeds with their shells to those with shells removed

Creative Area

Leaf rubbing- place a fallen leaf under a sheet of paper and gently shade over it with the side of a pencil

Autumn colour mixing- explore colour theory by mixing red, yellow, and brown paints in different ratios

Autumnal blow art painting using straws

Leaf painting- paint leaves a and hung them on a string to create a bunting

Leaf outlines- draw leaf outlines and fill them with dots to count.

English-Reading Corner

Cosy little space with autumn themed books display Read and discuss books to check comprehension

Talk about: weather, days of the week, months of the year

Writing Area

Name recognition (Have different names written on pieces of paper. Teach your child to recognise, pick up and display his own name)

Name tracing- trace own name on dotted line.

Autumn themed **line tracing** sheets

Letter tracing/writing CVC words writing

Words and short sentences writing

Sand/Water Area

A tray with soil and orange pom-poms to create a pumpkin patch

A bowl of water with leaves and conkers to sort floating and sinking objects

Experiences/Visits

Nature/park walks- Signs of Autumn scavenger hunt. (have a sheet of paper with printed signs of autumn for your child to tick the identified signs)

-leaves, sticks, conkers collection

Make fresh bread, cinnamon rolls, cinnamon biscuits.

(discuss about autumn scents)
